I would respectfully request that the Glocester Town Council appoint Gerald Mosca of Glocester as the new Emergency Management Director and request that this appointment become effective July 2nd 2017 with a part-time salary of \$9000.

On Tuesday June 20, 2017 three Glocester residents were interviewed for the EMA Director position by Glocester Fire Chiefs and Police Chief. The interview committee unanimously agreed that Gerald Mosca had the skills, abilities, and experience to be an effective and a progressive Emergency Management Director for the Town of Glocester.

Mr. Mosca has extensive emergency management and homeland security experience to include deployment as operations chief with FEMA/Homeland Security in national natural disaster operations. He was also employed by the Town of Scituate as EMA Director over the past two years where he created and managed their Community Emergency Response Team, draft submit and manage Emergency Management/Homeland Security grants; and updated hazard mitigation and operational emergency readiness plans.

I would further support the increase in his **part-time salary to \$9,000** in the FY-2018 budget based on his extensive emergency management training and experience which will be an asset to the Town of Glocester as the EMA Department moves forward. This appointment is contingent upon Mr.
